The AABS is an organization of people of all ages and walks of life interested in learning about and promoting the art of bonsai. Individual experience in growing bonsai ranges from none to many years.










The regional nature of our Club is reflected in our membership, which includes people from as far away as Midland, Lansing and Toledo as well as southeastern Michigan.
